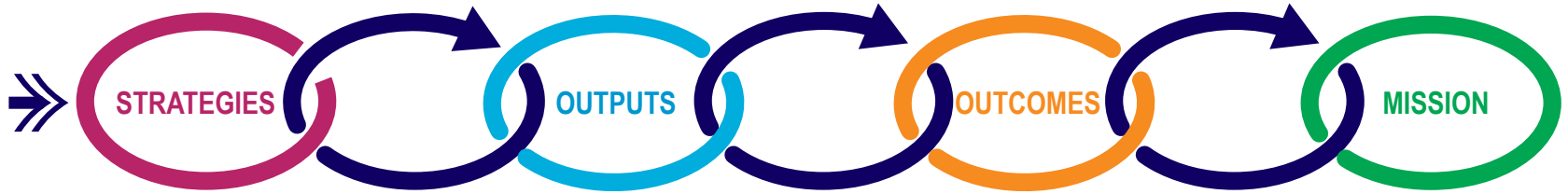


THEORY OF CHANGE

A commitment by APRIES to form a coalition of important actors from different sectors for ending slavery conditions at scale. The 5 conditions of the Collect Impact Approach:

Common Agenda

Shared Measurement

Mutually Reinforcing Activities

Continous Communication

Backbone Organization

EXPLORE
Establish a common agenda with all key partners

Establish administrative center (AC)

PREPARE
Develop a database of key stakeholders, prevalence data, and service gaps

Engage key stakeholders
Collect prevalence data
Identify common indicators
Identify service gaps

IMPLEMENT
Transform programs to prosecute, protect, and prevent modern slavery

Select implementing partners
Build capacity
Provide technical assistance
Evaluate impact

SUSTAIN
Support implementing partners to sustain and grow program through on-going support

To drastically reduce the prevalence of modern slavery in sub-Saharan Africa



People are freed from all forms of violence with civil and human rights protections

Key Assumptions

- No single organization can end slavery
- Large-scale social change comes from better cross-sector coordination
- Survivors' voices are essential for success in prosecution, protection, and prevention
- Public and private sectors are essential partners

Challenges

- Slavery is a complex, multi-sector social problem
- Uncoordinated, isolated efforts currently exists with limited funding for scaling up
- Limited understanding of prevalence and impact of exisiting efforts due to hard to reach populations and limited measurement methodolgy

Objectives

- 1) Collect, analyze, and establish robust baseline data on the prevalence of modern slavery in target communities in Sierra Leone and Guinea.
- 2) Enhance the quality and scope of our implementing partners' anti-slavery operations in 5-10% reduction in baseline reporting and 25% increase in number of victims served
